KHAN ACADEMY CLASSES

DMA has introduced Khan Academy classes in its academic curriculum as a major step to facilitate the learning and understanding for the students through the free video tutorials and interactive exercises. Khan Academy is an American non-profit educational organization created in 2008 by Sal Khan. Its goal is creating a set of online tools that help educate students. The organization produces short lessons in the form of videos. Its website also includes supplementary practice exercises and materials for educators. All resources are available for free to users of the website and application. It is totally aligned with the CBSE curriculum, NCERT and other publication books. The quizzes and unit tests help spot check the student's concept mastery. Students who are struggling with concept, can take the hint or get concept reiterated from teacher for scoring better. Provides immediate feedback, and offers opportunities for teachers and students to direct their learning.

With Khan Academy, teachers can identify gaps in their students' understanding, tailor instruction, and meet the needs of every student.

This concept has been implemented in classes 7, 8 and 9.
