A VISIT TO AUGARHNATH TEMPLE & SHAHID SMARAK (27TH SEPTEMBER 2023)

DMA always provides opportunities to students for their holistic development. Keeping this in view, a visit to historical places of Meerut was arranged. The students of grade seven of travel and tourism club visited the historic Kali Paltan Temple and Shahid Smarak on 27th September 2023.

There were 44 students escorted by three teachers. It was a wonderful experience for all the students as they learnt chanting of 'OM', 'Gayatri Mantra' and importance of parikrama by Swami Brahmadev in the Kali Paltan temple. Swami ji also shared his words of wisdom and enlightened them about the importance of spirituality in life. Students were also made aware of the historical importance of Augarhnath temple and the monument of the first war of independence. Thereafter, they visited Shahid Smarak where they saw the Sundial and Martyr's memorial 'Amar Jawan Jyoti ' containing the names of 85 soldiers of 3rd Bengal light cavalry who refused to use the cartridges of Enfield rifle during the 1857 revolt.

All the students were very excited to visit the museum at Shahid Smarak which is divided into 5 galleries that show cases a perfect pictorial representation of the revolt of 1857. Overall, it was an enriching experience for all the students.

COMPETENCY-BASED ASSESSMENT WORKSHOP (16TH SEPTEMBER 2023)

'If you want to be successful, don't seek success-seek competence, empowerment; do nothing short of the best that you can do.'

Dayawati Modi Academy organized a workshop on 'Competency-based Assessment' on Saturday, 16th September 2023 for the teachers from the Department of English, Science and Maths. It was organised by ACER- Australian Council for Educational Research an independent not-for-profit research organisation that uses global expertise to improve learning by creating and promoting research-based knowledge, products, and services. The vision of the workshop was to educate the teachers about competency-based assessment, PISA Competencies for Reading, Maths and Science, to connect NCERT learning outcomes to PISA competencies in different domains and to design domain specific competency-based assessments.

The workshop commenced on a pious note with the lighting of lamp, followed by the introduction of the resource people – Ms. Dimple Sood, Research officer, ACER and Ms. Shreevarshini K, Subject Matter Expert, ACER, to the audience. They were warmly greeted and welcomed by the Principal Dr. (Mrs.) Ritu Dewan.

At the very outset, the participants radiated energies all around when they introduced themselves creatively using an appropriate adjective for themselves. It was a diverse activity enriched workshop. Subject-wise groups were formed. First, each group gave a presentation reflecting on strategies that promote competency-based teaching and learning in their respective classrooms. Through an interactive session, Ms. Dimple explained the concept of what competency-based assessment is and how it can be integrated with teaching and learning processes.

In the post tea session, Ms. Shreevarshini K. introduced the participants to PISA – Programme for International Student Assessment competency-based assessment for English, Maths and Science that evaluates the skills and knowledge of students in the age group of 15 year after completion of school learning. The participants recapitulated the concepts of traditional and competency-based assessments participating in Snap and Clap activity. Next Activity performed by the teachers focused on the alignment of learning outcomes to PISA Competencies in the subjects of Science, Maths and English at the primary and Secondary grade levels.

The post lunch session saw the participants in the subject -wise assigned groups preparing competency-based items using visual stimulus including MCQs with a stem and a set of alternatives that are credible but incorrect, Fill ups and True /False etc. to assess the required competencies related to a particular domain. Then the group leaders gave a presentation on questions prepared assessing different competencies. The session reached its crescendo when all the participants responded actively and zealously to a quiz activity - 'Jeopardy' reflecting their overall understanding of the concept of competency-based assessment.

The session concluded with a vote of thanks and a group photograph of all the participants. Overall, it was highly informative, engaging and enriching for all the attendees.
